PET THREAT	WHO IT HURTS	WHY	STAY SAFE
Toxic Flowers and Plants	Cats and Dogs	Lilies, daffodils, holly and some greenery contain toxins that can be harmful to certain species if ingested.	Visit aspca.org for a listing of safe and unsafe flowers and plants for your home.
Batteries	Cats and Dogs	Larger batteries pose a choking hazard, while smaller ones can leak battery acid and perforate the intestine once swallowed.	Store batteries in a sealed container in a high cabinet.
Pennies	Cats and Dogs	The zinc can cause anemia if eaten.	Transfer loose change to a tightly closed container.
Dryer Sheets	Cats and Dogs (more commonly cats)	Pets can choke on dryer sheets, which may obstruct the bowel if ingested.	Dispose of used sheets in covered trash bins, and keep unused ones in their box out of easy reach.
Floss and Thread	Cats and Dogs (more commonly cats)	Both can cause linear and twisting bowel obstruction.	Throw away floss and threads in closed garbage bins.
Empty Cans	Cats and Small Dogs	When poking their heads in, pets can suffer cuts and bruises—or even get their heads stuck!	Wash cans and crush them completely before placing in a covered recycling bin.
